Officers will use Club Central to perform administrative processes such as membership registration, dues payment, registration for educational awards, and the extraction of various reports.

At the beginning of your term of office, please first verify the club information registered in the system.

Are the club's address, website address, meeting dates and frequency correct? The area assignment of clubs by the District is based on the address registered here, so be sure to check. Also, the "Find a Club" function on the Toastmasters website (https://www.toastmasters.org/find-a-club) uses this address to display clubs on the map.

Are the club type, language, and representative name correct?

Is the club's supplementary information registered correctly?
